Equidistance Lattice Structure

There are many matrices that have been claimed as proof of the Equidistance Lattice Structure, or more commonly known as the Bible Code. But the most amazing results are also the most widespread, because where the other EDLS codes need a special Hebrew Bible and the spaces to be removed, as well as a special computer program to analyze and detect the codes, the most amazing revelations can use any Bible so long as it is a faithful translation. Alchemy

One of the dark arts, and originating in Europe, it literally spanned the globe, with references being found in Greece, China, India, and the Middle East. In Japan, it was called 'renkenjutsu'. In Latin, it was called 'Ars regalia', or the 'Royal Art'.

In history, there have always been 2 kinds of alchemy. The first says the their work is only able to proceed because God helps them and provides for them. This branch proceeded along, and was eventually replaced by chemistry. (Any time you read about a 'chemist' before 1700, it is probably an alchemist relabeled under revisionist history.)

The second kind continued and developed into the dark art it is today. Quoting from the Philosophers of Nature Seminar transcripts of their last seminar in 1992, "There is no creating God in the universe apart from Man. The total creation is a work of Man." I think that puts their philosophy better than any way I could have.

Is alchemy appealing? Yes, it is. It can be described as 'equational magic'. Where other dark arts are immersed in rituals and rites, alchemy is based on calculations and equations. Some of the base equations are no more difficult that 7th or 8th grade math, and I think that the hardest is about 10th or 11th grade pre-calculus level. Basically anyone with a \$100 calculator and the knowledge to use it can do alchemy.

What is the purpose of alchemy? Alchemists are looking for a couple of things. The first is the Philosopher's Stone (you may remember that the original title of the first

movie was Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone), which is supposed to be able to turn lead, a 'base' metal, into the most refined metal, gold. Our government can actually do this with a laser beam, but it costs something like \$3 billion for \$300 worth of gold, which means it isn't worth it. Anyway, there were a few, a very few, alchemists who were supposed to have been able to attain this. One of these few was Raymond Lull, who was made a saint in the Catholic Church for his preaching of the gospel to Muslims in the Middle East on his travels, or something like that.

The second thing they are looking for is the Panacea, or Elixir of Life, which is supposed to be able to give someone perfect health no matter what, and some legends say it can even give immortality to the one who consumes it. This is a counterfeit for eternal life, and is something no Christian alchemist ever tried to find, at least no true Christian alchemist.

How does it get through to people in our culture? Music, movies, video games, TV shows, you name it. But, we already knew that Satan stops at nothing, right? Alchemy is only one small part of his plans to deceive humanity, and it is actually only perverted alchemy that does so.

All chemists are also alchemists, so remember, alchemy is like knowledge – it's not good or bad, it's how it's used that counts as good or bad. True alchemists almost always call themselves chemists, but it's that same study of the elements and chemical reactions. In modern times, alchemy is used almost exclusively to reference the dark art side of the practice, so if you hear the actual word alchemy, you know what is meant (unless it's in reference to history, of course).

Sylvia Browne—Opal Jo Jennings

Opal Jo Jennings was a 6-year-old girl that was abducted in March 1999 in Texas. Her grandmother, Audrey Sanderford, went on Montel to speak with Sylvia Browne about this. She appeared on the show April 29, 1999, several weeks later.

On that show, Sylvia Browne made the following statements:

1. Opal was not dead
2. She was in Japan
3. The town was Kukouro or Kukoura (with several syllables, not like the town of Kuro)
4. Opal's abductor was white
5. Opal's abductor was male
6. The abductor sold her on an Asian market
7. She was sold into "white slavery"
8. And that Opal had been transported there by either a boat or a plane.

In December 2003, her remains were found. Let's examine the predictions point by point.

1. The autopsy showed she died a few hours after being abducted, so weeks later when her grandmother went on Montel she would have still been dead.

2. Her remains were found in Texas, near Fort Worth, just 13 miles from the abduction site.
3. But of course! Kukouro, Kukoura, Fort Worth, they all sound so similar.
4. Correct, but already known from eyewitnesses of the abduction.
5. Also correct, but already known from eyewitnesses of the abduction.
6. The abductor did not sell her. He killer her and dumped the body.
7. Opal was in the ground, not white slavery.
8. Opal was transported by auto, whether truck, van, or car, I don't know, but it certainly wasn't boat or plane, and for a distance of 13 miles, it would be illogical to believe this about non-ground transport.

Prediction Breakdown

Sylvia Browne – 2007 Predictions

Sylvia Browne appeared on the Montel show to make predictions about the next year. The year she predicted about was 2007. Since we all lived it, let's look at what she said would happen.

2. More states will approve gay marriages. (She expressly stated that it is gay marriage, not civil unions, that will be approved.)
 - a. Nope. Only the one state that had it before she made that prediction allows gay marriages.
3. FIMA will be investigated.
 - a. Nope.
4. People will go to jail (as a result of the above predicted investigation).
 - a. No one can go to jail from a non-existent investigation, can they?
5. The next few are really closely related, but separate predictions. There will be major drug busts in 2007. There will be a big one on the east coast
 - a. No.
6. There will be another one on the west coast.
 - a. No.
7. These will be 2 of the biggest drug busts ever.
 - a. Wanna guess? I'll give you just one chance. Like the response to number 4, drug busts that don't happen can't be among the biggest drug busts ever.

8. We will see parts of bombs come in (this is in a group of the dialog about terrorism. Ports are also mentioned here.)
- a. This is false
9. There will be no major terror attacks on the US.
- a. This is true. If I predict this same thing every year for the next 50 years, I will probably be about 90% accurate, or 45 years of the 50 without an attack. It's very rare that there will be such an attack. Saying there won't be one is the safe bet.
10. England will have a terrorist attack.
- a. No.
11. So will France.
- a. No
12. The economy will enter a lull, but by midyear will really come up.
- a. This is both very vague and also not very accurate to what actually happened. But since the show was most likely just after Christmas, it would be correct because people would have just spent a bunch of money on Christmas presents. It's the general trend each year. Big spending before Christmas, little spending after (unless it is to exchange or to hit sales, but those still don't compare to pre-Christmas sales. Not even a bit).
13. The best investment for the next year (2007) is property.
- a. Not in any way. Despite the fact that property is, in general, a very good investment, and therefore the one an educated guesser like myself would choose, it was wrong. In 2007, property value started falling, and it is still falling even now. With subprime mortgages going nuclear, it's adding fuel to the fire. I wonder just how many people are now out because they trusted her. How many subprime mortgages were taken out by people expecting to have more value because of this psycho psychic? And if she can really see the future, then she is cruel for doing this as well.
14. Property will go down, but the year after (2008) it will go up.
