## **Review of What Happened to the Dinosaurs? After the Flood**

Previously I have written about Phillip O'Donnell and his products. It is my pleasure to write yet again, but this time about a DVD which is new! That's right – on December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2008, Phillip O'Donnell debuted a new DVD on his site – What Happened to the Dinosaurs? This DVD is in presentation format with Phillip O'Donnell as the speaker.

What can I tell you? I have already written about how his first productions – Dinosaurs: Dead or Alive, both the book and DVD, explained that dinosaurs may still be alive. The shock of it may be over in that regards, but that is only the surface! This DVD is almost twice the length of his other DVD, and contains information that is both more up-to-date and more in-depth.

What will you see? A few pictures of suspected dinosaurs, artifacts showing dinosaurs (shattering the theory of evolution), learn of dinosaur sightings in the past and hear the written eyewitness reports throughout history of these creatures that are supposed to have been dead for 60 million years before man.

Dragons would be terrible lizards, correct? In other words, dragons would be dinosauria (“terrible lizards” in Latin). See how ‘dragons’ of the past may mean ‘dinosaurs’ in our present and future in the new DVD What Happened to the Dinosaurs? After the Flood.

## **Review of Talk the Walk Christmas Bundle**

For Christmas this year, I bought myself a gift (because I doubted anyone else would buy this gift for me) – the Talk the Walk Christmas Bundle. The Christmas Bundle had

all 6 of Todd Friel's products in it. I already had The Case for Atheism where he debated Dan Barker, but I didn't have the other five.

The 6 items are (in what I have tried to make a chronological order by their production):

Slaying the Dragon (audio CD)

Decisions, Decisions (DVD)

The Case for Atheism: There Isn't One (DVD)

Herman Who? (DVD)

Terrified! (MP3 CD)

Beyond the Shadow of a Doubt (DVD)

Now to go through and review each of them:

### **Slaying the Dragon (audio CD)**

Unlike every other item in this bundle, this one came in a cardboard sleeve instead of a box. Not that that is bad, but if you order all 6 of these and you only get 5 boxes, check for a small cardboard sleeve for the last item. I started listening to it several times and stopped near the end of the introduction two or three times because Todd is congratulating the person listening for trying to become a better husband and father, and I always feel like I shouldn't be listening to it because I am neither of those things (isn't it Christian how singleness and childlessness go nicely together?).

### **Decisions, Decisions (DVD)**

The content was very good. However, the visuals were bad. Several times the screen would just go black for a second or two. These "black frames" as I will call them, appeared several times. The main camera loses focus once and they have to switch to a different camera. On top of that, Todd moved around a bit and the camera didn't follow him very well. Todd says that light moves at 136-138 thousand miles per second (it actually moves at 186,000 miles per second). Setting these numerous problems aside, the DVD was excellent. If you need help making the right decision, get this DVD. None of the problems are big deals, and if they are for you, then just listen to it since the problems are based on the image not the sound. Very good.

### **The Case for Atheism: There Isn't One (DVD)**

A debate between Dan Barker and Todd Friel about the existence of God. Very good. For more, please see my complete review which was part of the Christmas review catalog.

### **Herman Who? (DVD)**

A hermeneutics primer. Very good. Excellent graphics. No visual problems like Decisions, Decisions had. Somewhat complex in areas, but still very good. If you aren't good at interpreting scripture, get this DVD. If you want a better hermeneutics system, might I suggest the system that I developed, which is outlined in the Levels of Scriptural Interpretation articles. I know that it's my system, so I'm a biased observer, but I still feel that it is a more thorough system of interpretation than the one related in Herman Who. Very good DVD.

### **Terrified! (MP3 CD)**

Twenty-six tracks of perfect examples for law to the proud and grace to the humble. Listen as Todd witnesses to Mormons, atheists, and drunk chicks! It comes with a handbook for teaching the Way of the Master program. Very good.

### **Beyond the Shadow of a Doubt (DVD)**

There are 2 DVD's in this product. The first one is called "Why are you here?" and looks at the reason why people were created. The second one is called "A shoelace is not a banana peel". It starts out with a wonderful run through of the post-modern mindset which says that all truth is valid truth. It concludes speaking about the nature of a covenant as an 'unto death' death.

To sum up, get them all! They are all great. And even if you aren't needing instruction in witnessing (as is the purpose of the Terrified mp3 CD) or you aren't having a problem with pornography (as is the purpose of the Slaying the Dragon CD) you should still get them anyway. Not just because it's cheaper to get the bundle than to get the ones you want individually, but because the teachings can help you to deal with others who do have those problems. Buy, buy, buy!

### **Betrayal By Silence**

What is the worst thing a Christian can do? I propose that it is to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and heal the sick – without speaking about Jesus. Is it loving for you to stay so sinfully silent, when you have the cure? Is it?

### **Apology**

I just want to apologize. I had focused so much on different articles that I had completely forgotten to write an article to explain how to share your faith. That is the reason for the church – to seek and to save the lost. I feel very bad that I had not done this sooner. You probably know that I love the Way of the Master, but some of you may not

know what that is. The following will outline that technique and style of evangelism, which I have used myself. It works, and more than that it is biblical. It is what Jesus did.

### **WDJD – What Did Jesus Do?**

The pre-step to this is to start a conversation. You can start by bringing up a famous person who has died recently, or a tragic event, then asking the person where they think they will go when they die. You could also start by asking if there are any good churches around the area. This opens you up to ask about their faith background.

If you are like me, and don't want to have to come up with one of those, use gospel tracts. I recommend Living Waters tracts. I never give out tracts other than Living Waters tracts. Of their tracts, the million dollar bills, billion dollar bills, round tuits, intelligence curveys, curved illusions, and many more are all very good. I personally use millions, tuits, curved illusions, and on occasion use a special tract (The Atheist Test is good for atheists, but not really a general-use tract like the others mentioned above.)

Once you have your tract, walk up to someone and say, "Did you get one of these? It's a gospel tract." This will give them something to read and break the ice. If the conversation is cut short, trust the tract, and make sure to tell them there is writing on the back so that they read it. But now that you have started the conversation, what do you say? WDJD – What Did Jesus Do?

Ask the person, "Would you consider yourself to be a good person?" This is the W in WDJD. The Bible states that most every person will proclaim his/her own goodness. Then, you can simply ask them the next part.

Ask the person, "Do you think you have kept the Ten Commandments?" This is the first D in WDJD. You could also segue here by asking them if you could prove that they are good people (They will most certainly agree to that question, because they want to tell you just how good they are). Then, go through some of the commandments. Some of the easiest ones are the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup>. But, just so you know some ways to ask about them, I will go through all of them.

#### The First Commandment

"I am the Lord your God; you shall have no other gods before me."

Don't start with this one. However, if someone is of a different religion and claims that they have kept all of the other commandments, show them that they have still broken them by not worshipping the One True God.

#### The Second Commandment

"You shall not make any graven images (idols)."

If someone says to you that "My god would never create Hell", tell them they are correct, because they have created a god in their own mind. They have made for themselves an idol and replaced the worship of the True God with their idol worship.

#### The Third Commandment

"You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain."

"Have you ever used the name of God in the place of a 4-letter filth word?"

### The Fourth Commandment

“Remember the Sabbath Day, to keep it holy.”

Since this one is really difficult, and also not as obviously a sin as the others, I focus on the others.

### The Fifth Commandment

“Honor your Father and your Mother.”

“Did you always obey your parents as a child? Did your mother or father ever have to ask you more than once for something?”

### The Sixth Commandment

“You shall not kill.”

“Have you ever killed someone?” Most people will say no. “Okay, but Jesus said that whoever even hates someone has committed murder in their heart. Have you ever hated someone? Then you are guilty of murder.”

### The Seventh Commandment

“You shall not commit adultery.”

“Have you ever committed adultery? Okay, but Jesus said that whoever even looks with lust commits adultery in the heart. Have you ever hated someone? Then you are guilty of adultery.”

### The Eighth Commandment

“You shall not steal.”

Ask if they have ever stolen, and they will most likely say no. Ask if they ever taken anything, no matter how valueless or how small. They will most likely then say yes.

### The Ninth Commandment

“You shall not lie.”

“Have you ever told a lie?” Some people will try to say that it was a white lie. One way to go around this is to ask a person how many lies they have told in their lives. Then, ask “What does that make you?” The person must then admit to being a liar.

### The Tenth Commandment

“You shall not covet.”

This is so obvious. Our entire economy is based on it. Simply ask, “Have you ever desired something that didn’t belong to you?”

Afterward, ask what that makes them. The person must respond that it makes them whatever that commandment corresponds to.

Next, ask the person, “If God were to judge you by the Ten Commandments, would you be innocent or guilty?” This is the J in WDJJ, and stands for Judgment. The person has just admitted that they have broken X number of commandments, and must admit that they are guilty.

Lastly, ask the person, “Would you go to Heaven or Hell?” This is the last D in WDJJ, and stands for Destiny. If they are honest, they must admit that they would go to Hell.

This next part will require some judgment on your part. You should only give the next part to someone who is serious and honestly thinking about it. If they are just mocking you, do not cast the pearl of the gospel before them.

Repent – Tell them that whatever sinful things they are doing, they must stop them.

Trust – On top of Repentance, the person must trust in Jesus Christ like one trusts in a parachute. That person must trust in Jesus Christ completely, and Jesus Christ alone.

Now, if anyone at any stage tries to argue with you, just reason with them to get them back on track. Also, some people will try to throw you off track. Keep on it. Don't feel bad if someone simply wants to end an encounter – let them go.
